Mr. Kashif Raza Gill DPO Khanewal and Mr. Prince Alvin DPO Multan explained role of CMT, networking with schools and district departments and community participation in the project activities. ## LIVELIHOOD & FOOD SECURITY PROGRAM

### Awareness Sessions for Livestock Management with Vaccination Camps in Karachi

Caritas Pakistan Karachi under their Smallholder Adaptive Farming Project organized the awareness sessions on best practices for Livestock management with vaccination camps at Ahsan Raza Goth, Gadap Town and Yaqoob Farm Gharo on 22nd and 23rd of April, 2021 with smallholder farmers. The objective of the awareness sessions and vaccination camps was to create awareness among the Small Farmers of Gadap Town and Gharo about the goat rearing for milk and meat production for better nutrition among children and women beneficiaries and vaccinated and treatment of the livestock to prevent them from different diseases. Mr. Amir Robin Coordinator the main facilitator of the session explained benefits of goats as a livelihood supplement for small farmers and women in rural areas. "It produce meat, milk, which improve your nutrition and addition to provide hide, fiber and manure. Caritas under smallholder adaptive farming project help you and provided veterinary care at your door step to protect your livestock's from different diseases," he said. Dr. Barket Ali shared the vaccination schedule for Livestock's in Pakistan with participants and said that vaccination is very important part of Livestock's health. 1172 Animals most them were Goats, Sheep, Buffalo and Cows were vaccinated of (ATV) and (HSV). The 375 goats, sheep's, buffalo and cows were treated suffering in different diseases in the Ahsan Raza Goth Gadap Town and Yaqoob Farm at Gharo. Mr. Mansha Noor, Executive Secretary of Caritas Pakistan Karachi said the program aimed at transferring knowledge and skills from experts to livestock farmers and the sharing of information and experiences amongst stakeholders in order to increase livestock production and productivity and nutrition among families of the smallholder farmers.

### Caritas Empowers Female Farmers in Remote Pakistani Villages

Caritas Pakistan Karachi under its Smallholder Adaptive Project launched its "Acre for Women" campaign to empower smallholder female farmers in the remote villages of Gharo and Gadap on the city's outskirts. The female farmers are owners of one-acre plots where they grow vegetables for their self-sufficiency to fight against malnutrition and hunger. Caritas Karachi formed women's farming groups in Gharo and Gadap and distributed kitchen gardening kits including summer vegetable seeds, organic manure and tools as well as offering training on climate change adaptation. "Our main objective is train women farmers to build their capacity in view of climate change and grow different vegetables for their own consumption and to fight against malnutrition and hunger," regional coordinator Amir Robin said. Mansha Noor, executive secretary of Caritas Pakistan Karachi, said the project was aimed at promoting healthy and organic produce for self-sufficiency and to improve nutrition among women and children. He further highlighted the importance and benefits of growing different vegetables as a group. Noor offered useful tips to participants on how to use less water efficiently to grow vegetables, which brings positive changes to their economic conditions and improves their livelihood. Local Muslim leader Raza Burfat thanked Caritas Pakistan Karachi for promoting the idea of kitchen gardening among female farmers and providing kitchen gardening kits.

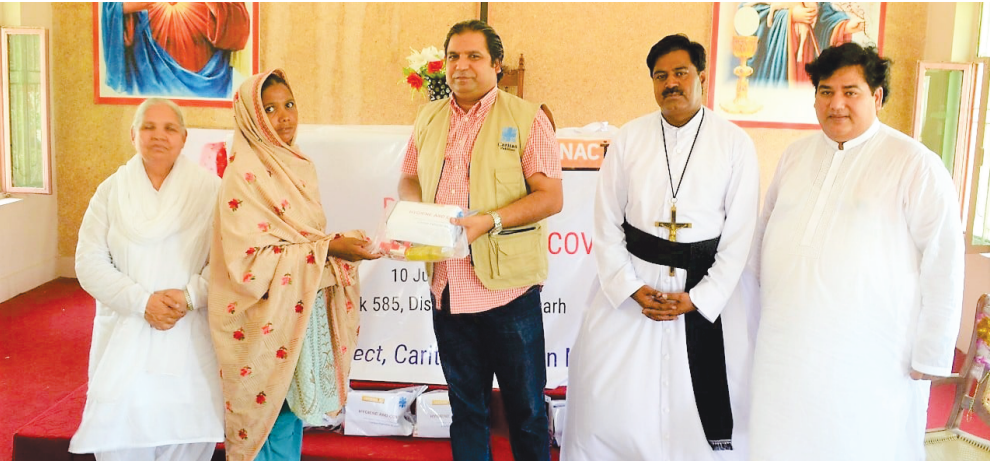

In June, Pakistan Government took precautions against the new SARS CoV2 variants and established stringent measures for detection of cases and tracing of contact.

## EMERGENCY

### Distribution of Hygiene and COVID 19 Safety Kit in Multan

Caritas Pakistan Multan under WASH initiatives in remote areas of PAKISTAN organized distribution of Hygiene and COVID 19 Safety Kit at Chack Number 585/TDA Derrickabad District Muzaffargarh on June 9, 2021. Mr. Amjad Gulzar National Executive Director was the chief guest. Rev. Fr. Atta OMI Parish Priest and Sr. Philomena were also present. Ambrose Gill M&E Officer welcomed all participants especially Mr. Amjad Gulzar. Mr. Samuel Clement Executive Secretary CPM thanked CPNS and Mr. Amjad for granting this project to CPM. Mr. Samuel Clement also presented overview of the project activities in village 585 TDA. ### Exposure Visit to Earthquake Affected Abbottabad

This health facility was destroyed in 2005 Kashmir earthquake. Caritas Islamabad Rawalpindi rebuilt it in October 2008. According to Doctor Asif the facility is more equipped than other government centers. BHU Dalola has better medicine store and furnished quarters for the staff. More than 800 patients visit this center every month. Mr. Amjad Gulzar handed over COVID-19 personal protective equipment to the staff of BHU Dalola. He appreciated them for their dedicated service. "Dalola was ignored and we planned a long term response. It is the government responsibility to equip this mini hospital properly. Healing service in such remote areas is a great challenge," he said.

## COMMUNITY BASED DISASTER RISK MANAGEMENT (CBDRM)

### Caritas Preparing for Monsoon Disasters in Karachi

Pakistan is getting ready for monsoon rains, both those associated with the gap in temperatures between land and sea and those caused by short-term phenomena that have become intense in the last few years. The weather is currently pleasant in Karachi, but in a few weeks' heavy rains will come, often bringing disasters. For this reason, Caritas held a seminar last Thursday on monsoon preparation and mitigation as part of a project on community risk management. This brought together local civil protection committees and volunteers from the Shireen Jinnah Colony, FC Area, Lalu Khait, Yousaf Goth, Saifuel Maurri Goth and Kuasar Naizai Colony. The aim was to raise awareness about prevention and how an efficient response can reduce the impact of disasters and save many lives in the event of heavy rainfall and flooding in urban areas. In his welcome speech, Caritas coordinator Mansha Noor stressed the need to take every precautionary step and engage in careful planning to face flooding, citing Noah's biblical story as an example. Amir Robin, coordinator of the National Monitoring and Evaluation Commission for the South Region, highlighted the importance of protecting homes and neighborhoods to reduce the loss of life and property during floods in Karachi. In particular, he cited the extreme vulnerability of the homeless families in Gujjar Nalla and those at risk of eviction. The adoption of construction techniques to build more disaster-resistant housing was also mentioned. Sarfraz Anwar, one of the project's organisers, was tasked with explaining some simple rules of conduct that can help save lives during a flood. Such rules include staying away from power lines and being extra cautious with electronic devices; staying away from trees, poles and signs posts; preparing emergency supplies of food, medicines, drinking water, torches, and fuel; avoiding food made damp and stale by flood water; and paying special attention to seniors, children, women and the disabled. Anwar also recommended that the authorities follow government directives to keep up to date with the latest information about the rain and emergencies. Participants received posters to increase awareness of these rules. For their part, local civil protection committees called for more training exercises with rescue teams and asked for plastic bags to save documents and essential household items during emergencies. Caritas Pakistan plans to meet both requests.



### Mock drill with Rescue 1122 in Multan

Caritas Pakistan Multan jointly with Rescue 1122 Participated in Annual Mock Drill Organized by District Government Muzaffargarh on June 11, 2021 at bank of River Chenab. Mr. Ali Shahzad, Deputy Commissioner, District Muzaffargarh was the Chief Guest. He was accompanied by ADC Revenue Muzaffargarh. Caritas Pakistan Multan team of Volunteers and Members of ERT of 5 DMCs participated in the leadership of Mr. Amir Yaqoob, Program Coordinator DRR. Honorable DC appreciated all departments, schools and civil society organization for their active role and participation in mock drills. Mr. Amir Yaqoob briefed that DRR is our main thematic area and we are building Disaster Resilient Communities in Disaster Prone Districts in South Punjab particular. He also briefed that we have strong networking with district departments. He also offered that our volunteers along with the equipment they have for search and rescue will be available to District Government in case of any emergency situation.



## WASH

### Caritas Brings Drinking Water to A Rural Community in Sindh

Ahsas Raza Goth is a village in Sindh province. It had a water problem because its old submersible water pump was damaged and its new pump needed fixing. The community asked for help; Caritas Pakistan Karachi provided it. For Raza Barkat, a 60-year-old resident of the village, the Catholic charity "restored our life; we lived in a dire situation without water, especially our children, and women were suffering due to the water problem, but now everyone in the village is happy with the availability of water. The submersible pump stands at the entrance to our village." Due to the damage to the old pump and the breakdown of the pump installed by the Sindh government, which was the only source of water for the community and their livestock, residents were suffering badly, especially women who had to walk miles to get water to drink and cook. Caritas Pakistan Karachi traditionally works with and for underprivileged communities through various community development programmes and by raising awareness. Water shortages for human use (drinking, cooking, etc.) and agriculture (farming and livestock raisin) are a permanent problem. Mansha Noor, executive secretary of the Caritas Pakistan Karachi, together with Amir Robin and John Rehmat (Caritas coordinator), visited Ahsan Raza Goth to meet the villagers and inaugurate the new pump. Supporting a big smile along with village volunteers and Caritas staff, Mansha Noor pressed the button to activate the device. In his address, he expressed satisfaction with the result, noting that Caritas was aware of local water problems for some time and wanted to solve them, but could not due to a lack of resources. Amir Rubin congratulated the people of Ahsan Raza Goth and said the water will serve not only for drinking and cooking, but also for the livestock. He added that the submersible pump should be closely monitored or it could be damaged again. To mark the day and as part of Caritas Pakistan's "One Million More Trees" campaign, neem and berry were planted.



### Drinking Water Facility for Karachi Village

Caritas Pakistan Karachi under their "WASH Initiatives in Remote Aras of Pakistan" project restored drinking water facility of hand pumps of rural community of landless farms at Yaqoob Farm, Gharo on 13th of May, 2021. Due to the water of the hand pumps which were installed by Sister Mary Grace three years ago were contaminated and not safe for drinking and cooking. Women and girls in particular had to walk miles to fetch water for drinking and cooking. Caritas Pakistan Karachi under the project of "WASH Initiatives in Remote Aras of Pakistan" managed to make new bores with fixed 2000 meter pipes with the help of Wash Committee members in Yaqoob Farm village to restore five hand pumps. Fr. Anthony Abraz, Parish Priest of St. Thomas's Parish was the Chief Guest. Fr. Daniel O' Connor, Incharge of Mission Commission, Fr. Afzal Gulfam, Assistant Parish Priest, Deacon Barnabass, catechists and Caritas staff inaugurated the hand pumps. The members of the Wash Initiative Committees (WIC) and children of the village showered rose petals on the guests. Mr. Mansha Noor, Executive Secretary CPK congratulated the women of whole village for facility of drinking water at your door step. Rev. Fr. Anthony Abraz, Chief Guest thanked to Caritas for selecting Yaqoob Farm on his request to provide drinking water facility. "We were in dire straits without water, especially our children and women," said Mr. Ramsha member of Wash Committee. To commemorate the event in view of the "One Million More tree plantation campaign" of Caritas Pakistan, Neem plants were also planted.



### Training of trainers on WASH and COVID-19

Caritas Pakistan Multan organized TOT on WASH and COVID 19 on May 5, 2021. More than 32 members of 10 WASH Committees from 10 target Districts of Khanewal and Muzaffargarh participated. Mr. Ambrose Gill shared community participation in meaningful manners to achieve project objectives. Mr. Samuel Clement welcomed all participants and Rev. Fr. Yousaf Sohan Vicar General Catholic Diocese of Multan. Rev. Fr. Yousaf Sohan Appreciated the efforts of Caritas Pakistan for supporting the communities with knowledge, skills and necessary material support. Dr. Ali Abu-Zar (Assistant Professor and IN charge COVID WARD Nishtar Hospital Multan) conducted session on COVID 19.
